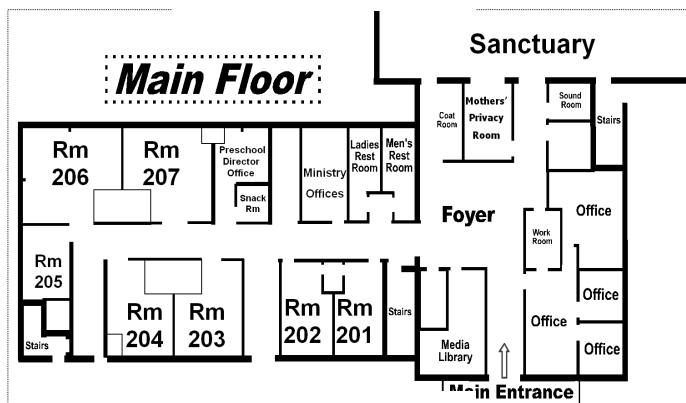

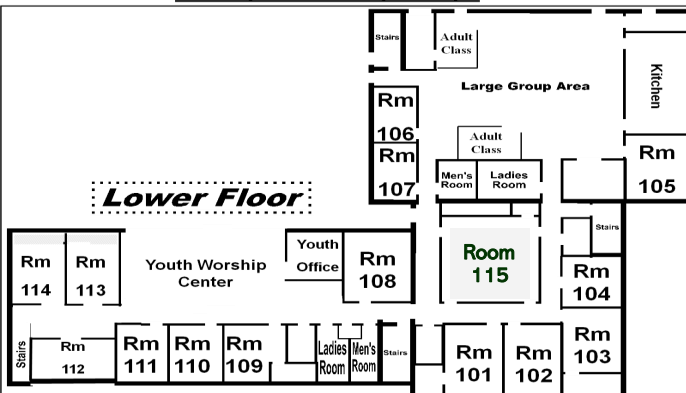

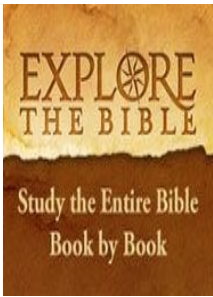

Description: “I recently had an early flight to catch. To get to the airport on time, I was in my car and on the road before the sun came up. The drive was dark, unhurried, and serene. It was a

far cry from my typical morning routine. Then, the sun began to rise. In a matter of minutes, the entire landscape came to life. A new day was unfolding—it was majestic. In the quiet moments, I felt hopeful curiosity. What would this day bring? These first magnificent moments hinted that good things lie ahead.

Genesis offers a similar beginning. While all of God’s Word reveals who He is and what He is like, Genesis lays important groundwork. This quarter we will study God’s design for all He has created and His plans for His people. God’s character shines through these initial pages of Scripture. He is creative, holy, and merciful. God makes promises, then faithfully keeps them.

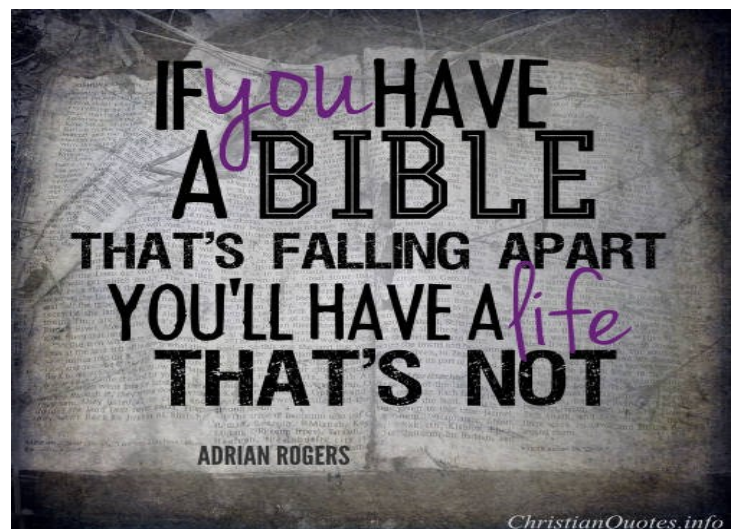
Topic: *Building A Caring Community*

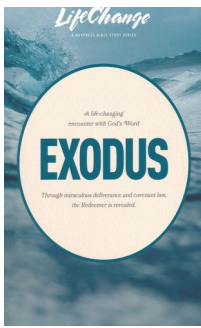

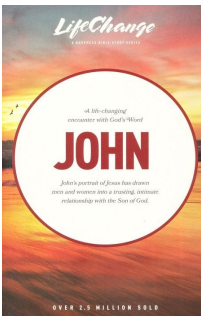
Description: *The Story of Humanity's Redemption Continues*
